



#### ASHRAE NEW YORK CHAPTER HISTORY OUTLINE

ASHRAE, founded in 1894, is an international organization of some 50,000 persons. ASHRAE fulfills its mission of advancing heating, ventilation, air conditioning and refrigeration to serve humanity and promote a sustainable world through research, standards writing, publishing and continuing education.

The New York Chapter of the American Society of Heating and Ventilating Engineers, as it was known until 1954, was organized in 1911 after the parent society was in existence for several years. To make this outline history more complete it will include some early events preceding the formation of the Society and the Chapter. In the 19th Century heating and ventilating of large buildings was in its infancy and the possibility of cooling air was a dream in the minds of few people.

- Daniel Livingston Holden was the first person in the U.S. to actively pursue the commercialization of mechanical refrigeration. He supervised the installation of a Carre aqua-ammonia absorption refrigeration system for ice making.
- 1877 Applications of steam heating were advanced by the introduction of remote central heating plants. The first was attempted by Birdsall Holley at Lockport, N.Y.
- 1880 The New York Steam Company began laying pipes in the streets of New York. The original plant on Cortland Street was the largest in the world and had 58 boilers.
  - One of the most influential persons in the development of engineered building systems was Alfred R. Wolff who designed many of the most important projects of the time, including the Siegel-Cooper Co. Department Store, the Hotel Astoria, St. Lukes Hospital, Carnegie Hall, The New York Life Insurance Building and the Metropolitan Life Building using steam, hot water and hot air systems.
- 1894 At a meeting of likeminded engineers in New York City, The American Society of Heating and Ventilating Engineers, ASHVE, was formed with 75 Charter Members. Hugh J. Barron is considered the founder of the Society to improve fellowship among its members.
- In 1998, New York City celebrated the centennial of the consolidation of forty municipalities, including the separate cities of Brooklyn and New York, into five boroughs that comprise "Greater New York". The 1898 charter united not only geography, but also the disparate heritage of native-born Americans and immigrants who were, and continue to be, drawn to New York as the most visible symbol of the United States of America as a promised land.

- 1901 300-ton co-generation comfort air conditioning system installed at New York Exchange. System designed by Alfred Wolf. Used absorption refrigeration machinery designed by Henry Torrance, Carbondale Machine Co.

- Willis Carrier designed an air conditioning machine, at that time was called "Apparatus for Treating Air", and was built for the Sackett-Wilhelms Lithographing and Publishing Co. in Brooklyn, N.Y.
  Air conditioning system was designed for precise humidity control.
- The American Society of Refrigerating Engineers (ASRE) was founded to give proper attention to engineering matters regarding refrigeration. This was the second precursor Society of ASHRAE. John Starr was the Societies first president. Starr designed the pipeline system of refrigeration for which he received a medal from the Franklin Institute. Starr, who was often characterized as "the dean of refrigerating", was acknowledged during the first half of the 20th Century to be the most respected and well-known of the early refrigerating engineers. - Willis H. Carrier produced the first psychrometric chart similar to the one we use today. Carrier called it hygrometric chart. The chart measurable psychrometric properties: Dry-Bulb Temperature, Wet-Bulb Temperature, Dew-Point Temperature, Relative Humidity, and Barometric Pressure. The chart calculable psychrometric properties: Specific Enthalpy, Specific Volume, Humidity Ratio, and Water Vapor Pressure. (Source: Donald P. Gatley, P.E., Psychrometric Chart Celebrates 100th Anniversary.)
- 1904 First air conditioned bank: Hanover National Bank, New York, by Alfred Wolf
- 1905 John E. Starr, ASRE President, first NY Chapter ASRE president in 1917-1918 and second term Chapter President in 1918-1919
- 1906 Willis H. Carrier, 1876-1950, received his first patent in 1906 for "Apparatus for Treating Air". The term "Air Conditioning" coined by Stuart H. Cramer, a Charlotte, N.C., textile engineer. He used the phrase in a 1906 patent application that added water vapor to the air in textile plants. Air was used to condition the yams.
  - Willis H. Carrier served as ASHVE NY Chapter President in 1922-1923.
- 1906 Brooklyn Bridge subway station air conditioned.
- New York Chapter was organized on October 24th, 1911, 17 years after American Society of Heating and Ventilation Engineers was established. William M. Mackay, an ASHRAE founding member, became the first President of NY Chapter. Mackay was consulting engineer, manager of New York Radiator, Co., and New York Branch manager of Hart & Crouse, Co. So, by 2011 we shall be ready to celebrate New York Chapter Centennial. (ASHRAE New York Chapter website: www.ashraeny.org)

New York Chapter is not the first Society Chapter. Illinois Chapter was formed in Chicago on December 1906. In 2000 Illinois Chapter merged with Chicago Chapter. Today Illinois Chapter belongs to Region VI and has more than 1,000 members. Illinois Chapter was feeling lonely in those early years of the Society, so members of the Chapter suggested that New York Chapter should be formed. After New York Chapter was established in 1911, the Boston Chapter followed in 1912. As more Chapters were organized ASHVE was able to grow as a National Society addressing the needs of the industry on the national level.

1911 New York State Boiler and Pressure Law was first enacted in 1911.
In 1897 the New York City Police Department was responsible for enforcement of the boiler code. The fee was \$3.00 per boiler inspection.

1912 At the Society Winter Meeting NY Chapter presented the following recommendations for compulsory ventilation of movie houses:

5 sq.ft. per person exclusive of aisles, 90 cu.ft. per person;

20 cfm per person;

65-70 degrees F at breathing level when seated, with no drafts;

6 air changes per hour exhaust with more required for the booth.

Heat sources must not contaminate the air,

Gas fired heaters and coal stoves were prohibited. (History articles by Alfred Greenberg published in NY Chapter bulletins).

- 1912 For the first anniversary meeting of New York Chapter, which was held at Empire State Building, a souvenir handbook was published telling about how the Chapter was founded and listing all officers and members. It also contained a special Ode to the Chapter entitled "N.Y.C." and sung to the tune of Tammany". It was actually issued at the May meeting in 1912. (History articles by Alfred Greenberg published in NY Chapter bulletins).
- 1912 Frank G. McCann, Chief Engineer of NYC Board of Education, was elected as NY Chapter ASHVE President for one year of 1912-1913.
- 1913 **Dwight D. Kimball** was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1913-1914.

  NY Chapter set up a committee to arrange for a junior course in Heating and Ventilation at a local educational institution. (History articles by Alfred Greenberg published in NY Chapter bulletins).
- 1914 World War I, 1914-1918
- 1914 Walter S. Timmis was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1914-1915.

The NY Chapter membership counts 74 members.

The latest thrust in New York's effort was to study atmospheric conditions in printing plants. Walter S. Timmis, ASHVE NY Chapter President 1914-1915, and J.I. Lyle, officer of the chapter, worked with Willis Carrier at Buffalo Forge Co., in the early 1900's on various kinds of dehumidification systems. They found that mechanical refrigeration was the best and most economical. (History articles by Alfred Greenberg published in NY Chapter bulletins).

- 1915 William H. Driscoll was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1915-1916
- 1916 Arthur Ritter was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1916-1917
- 1916 The beefsteak dinner for the American Society of Refrigerating Engineers (ASRE) at Murrays Restaurant on December 5, 1916 in New York City, marked what would become a tradition for the Society, a dinner gathering of all the members as a finale to the annual and semi-annual meetings. (Source: ASHRAE Journal, June 1994, ASHRAE: 100 Years of Progress.)
- 1917 Frank K. Chew was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1917-1918

  NY Chapter of American Society of Refrigerating Engineers (ASRE) was established in 1917 and the first Chapter President was John E. Starr. In 1905 John Starr was elected ASRE President, in the second year after the Society was established.
- 1917 RCI Institute was founded by Guglielmo Marconi. Later renamed Technical Career Institutes (TCI).
  TCI Student Branch of ASHRAE was established in 1970? Today it is a very active Student Branch which enjoys the faculty support.

- 1918 P.H. Stewart was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1918-1919
   John E. Starr was NY Chapter ASRE President for the second term.
- 1919 Perry Wes was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1919-1920
   Henry Torrance was NY Chapter ASRE President. ASRE President in 1914-1915.
- 1919 Richard A. Wolff, the son of Alfred R. Wolff and a fellow graduate of Stevens Institute, and Leon L. Munier formed the firm of Wolff & Munier, Inc. to do contracting and engineering. The firm did work in several parts of the U.S. and also overseas.
- 1920 W.L. Fleisher was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1920-1921
   Henry Torrance was NY Chapter ASRE President for second term.
- 1921 Fred Ophuls, ASRE President, NY Chapter ASRE Member.
  - A.S. Armagnac was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1921-1922 Van R.H. Greene was NY Chapter ASRE President. ASRE President in 1925-1926
- 1922 W.H. Carrier was NY Chapter ASHVE President în 1922-1923, President ASRE 1927, President ASHVE 1931.
  - H.P. Hill was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1923 W.L. Durand was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1923-1924
   Charles R. Nelson was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- William J. Olvany, Sr. was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1924-1925
   William J. Garrison was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1925 Van R.H.Greene, ASRE President, NY Chapter ASRE President in 1921-1922
  - A.A. Adlerwas NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1925-1926
    Ira E. MacFarland was NY Chapter ASRE President in 1925-1926 and 1933-1934.
- Air conditioning system with early centrifugal chiller designed by W. Carrier was installed in theater at the Rivoli on Broadway in New York City. It was called "refrigerating plant". Before, ice was used to cool the theater.
- 1926 R.H. Carpenter was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1926-1927 Stephen Benπis was NY Chapter ASRE President in 1926, 1927, and 1928.
- 1927 R.A. Wolf was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1927-1928
  Stephen Bennis was NY Chapter ASRE President in 1926, 1927, and 1928.
- 1928 Vendometer Corporation of New York introduced electrically refrigerated vending machine. (Source: Nagengast B. 100 Years of Air Conditioning)
- 1928 H.B. Hedges was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1928-1929
   Stephen Bennis was NY Chapter ASRE President in 1926, 1927, and 1928.
- 1929 E.J. Ritchie was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1929-1930
   Lloid A. Ramsey was NY Chapter ASRE President.

- 1930 Harry D. Edwards, ASRE President, NY Chapter ASRE Member.
  - Alfred Offner was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1930-1931. ASHVE President in 1946-1947. Logan L. Lewis was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1930 C.D.E Air Conditioning Co., Inc. (C.D.E.) was founded in 1930 as Commercial Domestic Electric by Joseph F. Azara, Sr.. In the early years the company operated as a refrigerator repairer and the name evolved to C.D.E. Refrigeration.

Joseph F. Azara, Jr. became company president in 1979. Joseph is recipient of Regional Award of Merit, NY Chapter Distinguished Service Award and Honorary Award, 1988-1999 NY Chapter President. Mr. Azara is the General Chairman of the 2008 ASHRAE Winter Meeting.

Brian J. Azara joined the company in 2005 after two years with Atkinson, Koven, Feinberg Engineers (AKF). Brian is "Third Generation" of Azaras in the HVAC Business. Also, Brian is on the NY Chapter Board of Governors.


- 1931 Rossell Donnelly was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1931-1932
  Crosby Field, Society Honorary Member, was NY Chapter ASRE President. ASRE President in 1938-1939
  Crosby Field was awarded F.Paul Anderson Award in 1968
- 1931 Rockefeller Center designed with air conditioning.
- 1932 Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad begins running first overnight train with air conditioning between New York and Washington.
- ASHVE's F.Paul Anderson Award was first presented in 1932 to Dr. Willis H. Carrier. The award was named for F. Paul Anderson, ASHVE president in 1927 and an ASHVE laboratory director from 1921 to 1925. As stated in an article documenting the presentation, the award "was given by the American Society of Heating and Ventilating Engineers in recognition of work done and meritorious services performed in the field of heating, ventilation or air conditioning". (Source: ASHRAE Journal, June 1994, ASHRAE: 100 Years of Progress).
- 1932 Louis T. M. Ralston was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1932-1933 Louis H. Roller was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1933 Harold Alt was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1933-1934
  Ira E. MacFarland was NY Chapter ASRE President in 1925-1926 and 1933-1934.
- 1934 Harry W. Fiedler was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1934-1935 Eustace C. Soares was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1935 Harry Harrison, ASRE President, NY Chapter ASRE Member.
  - W.W. Timmis was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1935-1936 Clifford F. Holske was NY Chapter ASRE President. ASRE President in 1948-1949.
- 1935 Alfred E. Stacey was head of research at Carrier Engineering. In 1935 he left Carrier Engineering and started his own business as a contractor/manufacturer in New York. The company was called Buensod-Stacey.
- 1936 G.E. Olsen was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1936-1937 James Larkin was NY Chapter ASRE President.

- 1937 Walter E. Heibel was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1937-1938 John Stone was NY Chapter ASRE President. ASRE President in 1945-1946.
- Buensod-Stacey and Trane teamed up in 1937 to produce the first practical hermetic centrifugal chiller suitable for wide distribution. Trane engineers developed the chiller through 1938, and unveiled it in 1939. This machine used R-113. Originally offered in 65 to 85 tons capacity, the Turbovac was the foundation for rapid growth in the coming years.
- 1938 Crosby Field, ASRE President, NY Chapter ASRE President in 1931-1932, Society Honorary Member.
  - Howard G. Meincke was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1938-1939 John Stone was NY Chapter ASRE President for the second term.
- 1939 World War II, 1939-1945.
  - 1942 Wartime Order L-38 bans the installation or manufacture of new air conditioning systems solely for personal comfort. Ban is lifted in 1945. (Source: Nagengast B., 100 Years of Air Conditioning)
- 1939 W.H. Carrier had an exhibit at the 1939 World's Fair in New York that was in shape of an igloo with 40-ft tall thermometers showing the interior and outdoor temperatures at the exhibit.
- 1939 Orion O. Oakes was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1939-1940
  Carl R. Kayan was NY Chapter ASRE President. Carl received Society Distinguished Service Award.
- 1939 First prototype compressor that was built in Carrier's New Jersey shop, after operating for years at a ceramics company in New York it was donated to the Smithsonian in Washington.
- 1940 Charles S. Pabst was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1940-1941 Richard E. Townsend was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1941 Joseph Wheeler, Jr. was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1941-1942 Cecil Boling was NY Chapter ASRE President. ASRE President in 1958-59.
- 1942 Harry H. Bond was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1942-1943 George I. Boone was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1943 Robert A. Wasson was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1943-1944 Robert C. Robertson was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1944 C. Steward Koehler was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1944-1945 James J. Corey was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1945 John F. Stone, ASRE President, NY Chapter ASRE President in 1937-1938 and 1938-1939
  - Harold J. Ryan, Distinguished 50 Year Member, was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1945-1946. He was awarded the Society Distinguished Service Award. Harold received New York Chapter Meritorious Service Award in 1979.
  - Paul J. Christensen was NY Chapter ASRE President. ASRE President in 1951-1952.
- 1946 Alfred J. Offner, ASHVE President, NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1930-1931.
  - Walter A. Sherbrooke was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1946-1947 Irwing J. Fajans was NY Chapter ASRE President.
- 1947 M.C. Giannini was NY Chapter ASHVE President in 1947-1948 Crawford Lee Babin was NY Chapter ASRE President.







On the local level the two Boards of Governors merged, as well, alternating Chapter President election from the pool of officers of former ASRE and ASHVAE Board of Governors. The first President of ASHRAE NY Chapter was Leonard D. Carr. Paul A. Bourquin, NY Chapter President 1963-1964, was the last alternating

Leonard Carr donated valuable Meeting Notices dated from 1958 through 1960 which are great source of historical information. We, members of NY Chapter, greatly appreciate Leonard's generous contribution to NY Chapter history.

A Special Society Meeting was held on December 1st, 1958 in Chicago, to vote on the American Society of Heating and Air- Conditioning Engineers (ASHAE) and American Society of Refrigerating Engineers (ASRE) merger plan. ASRE vote was held at its Annual Meeting in New Orleans on December 1, 1958. Members of each society overwhelmingly approved The Plan for Merger.

The New York Chapter President of ASHVE, at time of merger, was William J. Olvany and the Chapter President of ASRE was George J. Finck.

The headquarters offices of the newly established ASHRAE were located in New York City. Membership and Financial activities office was located at 62 Worth Street, under the direction of A.V. Hutchinson, Executive Secretary. All Technical and editorial activities located at 234 Fifth Avenue under the direction of R.C. Cross, Technical director. The geographical territory assigned to ASHRAE NY Chapter included Manhattan, Queens, The Bronx, Richmond and Westchester. NY Chapter officers for 1959-1960 were: Leonard Carr, President; Jerome M. 
